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COVID-19 and College Admissions

The current pandemic and its effects on the college admissions landscape is palpable amongst students in the Class of 2020. Many students were relying on this spring semester to visit their colleges and make their final enrollment decisions; however, with many colleges closed for the remainder of the semester and trying their best to maintain communication with applicants, our students may find themselves in a state of uncertainty. Many institutions have pushed back their enrollment deadlines to June 1 to accommodate for students who need more time to consider their options. Institutions that remain at a May 1 enrollment date have vowed to be more flexible with students who may need more time. The National Association for College Admission Counseling (NACAC) has created a database of colleges nationwide and updates to their admissions procedures during the pandemic: https://www.nacacnet.org/news--publications/newsroom/college-admission-s tatus-coronavirus/. This website will help students find out if their prospective college has opted to move back their enrollment deadline. As always, students can also visit their college's admissions page to see if there have been any changes to their policies due to the pandemic. Another great resource is from Cialfo:

In addition to the Class of 2020, juniors have also seen some difficulty in their college preparation plans. The spring semester is typically the time most juniors take the SAT or ACT; however, the College Board has canceled the rest of the test administrations for the school year and ACT has postponed their April exam to June (more information in the SAT and ACT Updates pages). This has caused some students anxiety since it only offers them a limited time to take the SAT as seniors. In light of this, some colleges have already determined that they will be going test optional for those applying for Fall 2021.

As colleges are moving towards virtual platforms to reach their prospective students, there are a number of opportunities for students to get their questions answered. As a substitute for their visitation programs, colleges have created **virtual tours** of their campuses. To supplement the tours, colleges are also providing **virtual information sessions** run by someone from the Admissions staff that also allow for students to ask their questions live. Rather than just emailing back and forth, some colleges have instituted **virtual meetings** with their admissions staff through platforms such as Zoom, Skype, etc. that give students an opportunity to speak with someone regarding their individual situations.

West Point

A big congratulations is due to Kacy Colletto for her acceptance into West Point US Military Academy! Striving to make a difference and positive impact in the world, Kacy was inspired to join the military. As her interest grew, she looked toward preparing for the extensive recruitment process. While most students start preparing their applications during senior year, Kacy started her application as early as her sophomore year. She will be majoring in Environmental Science and plans to work in the Army upon the completion of her 5 year service requirement. To anyone interested in the military and West Point, Kacy says, "I would say go for it. The application process and acceptance rate seems scary, but if you keep going and show the people involved that you are determined, then anything is possible." Congratulations and good luck, Kacy!





SAT Registration

SAT exams have been canceled for the remainder of the school year. Due to this development, the College Board has added a September test administration. Registration for the test dates below will open on May 26. Priority/Early Access registration will be available to the following students:

- Those who were registered to take the March 2020, May 2020, and June 2020 exams
- Members of the Class of 2021 who don't have SAT scores

Students that used a fee waiver to register for the March, May or June exams, are eligible to receive a fee waiver for a future test administration. Directions on how to do so will be sent to everyone in May through the College Board. Students who need to take the SAT Subject Tests will be able to do so during the regularly scheduled test administrations, except **September**.

ACT Registration

Students that were registered for the April 2020 test administration should have received an email from ACT informing them of the test postponement to June 13, in addition to instructions on how to reschedule for free. If a previously registered student cannot take the June 13 exam, a full refund will be issued. Students that used a fee waiver to register for the April exam will be able to reschedule without a fee.

Registration for 2020-2021 exam dates will open in July 2020.
