Scoir is the college research and application tracking program students will use as they begin to formulate post-secondary plans.

Scoir allows students to:

- Create a resume
- Take a career profile Assessment
- Research Individual Colleges

As Seniors....

- Let their counselor know what schools they are applying to
- See the application outcome data from students at their school
- Request teacher recommendations
- Request transcripts and other college entrance documents
















Standardized Tests 21-22







Test Optional Terminology





Test-Optional

Accepts but does not require test scores from applicants.



Test Flexible

Generally test-optional school that places limitations on applying without test scores (for instance, you might need to have a certain GPA in order to apply without a test score);





Will not consider test scores from any student, even those who might wish to submit them.
